

Addressing the Challenges in Preserving Intramuros' Cultural Tourism: Basis for Sustainable Development Plan

Abstract. Intramuros, the Manila's historical and cultural treasure, realizes significant challenges in preserving its heritage amongst the pressures of tourism development. This study explores the factors influencing preservation challenges and the impacts of cultural tourism, aiming to provide insights for sustainable development. Utilizing a quantitative approach, data were collected from 400 respondents in Intramuros, focusing on demographic profiles, preservation challenges, and tourism experiences. The findings reveal a strong correlation between preservation challenges and the effects of cultural tourism. Key challenges identified include inadequate public awareness, limited youth involvement in heritage conservation, and insufficient funding and resources for preservation activities. Respondents also emphasized the importance of regulating tourism activities, with the majority agreeing on the need for improved tourism management strategies. In addition, the study highlights that enhancing cultural experiences and increasing public education efforts can significantly improve the visitor experience while promoting historical preservation. Safety and security were also noted as critical elements influencing the competitiveness of Intramuros as a tourist destination. The study emphasizes the need for ongoing improvements in preservation practices, effective management of tourism activities, and adherence to updated sustainable development guidelines. It recommends prioritizing investments in preserving





Intramuros' cultural assets, improving local transportation systems, and fostering greater public involvement in conservation efforts. These initiatives aim to address the challenges of preserving cultural heritage sites amidst tourism development, ultimately supporting the preservation and promotion of Intramuros.

Cultural heritage is defined the collective inheritance of physical artifacts, also known as cultural property, as well as intangible characteristics that are passed down from previous generations within a particular group or community (Trivyzadakis, 2023). The concept of Lower case serves as a means of connecting the past and the future by employing certain methodologies in the present. The preservation and transmission of cultural heritage in contemporary times is facilitated by its inherent significance to various groups or communities, ensuring its continued existence and preserve advantages upon future generations.

Intramuros, commonly known as the "Walled City," is a tangible representation of the Philippines' intricate historical fabric. This renowned location, encompassed by ancient stone fortifications that have witnessed numerous centuries of historical events, has consistently served as a symbol of national esteem and a magnet for global cultural enthusiasts. The presence of cobbled streets, churches dating back centuries, and fortifications elicits nostalgia towards a previous period. However, Intramuros is currently confronted with a significant dilemma in the 21st century. It must navigate the complex task of safeguarding its cultural heritage while also contending with the formidable competition of several tourist attractions worldwide (Fabros et al., 2023).

The preservation of Intramuros holds a significance that transcends beyond its historical boundaries. The statement aligns with a broader conversation about the preserving of cultural assets, sustainable tourism practices, and the intricate equilibrium between economic progress and the safeguarding of cultural traditions. In its pursuit of maintaining its vitality as a tribute to the nation's history, this historic enclave invites us to delve into the many challenges associated with safeguarding cultural heritage amidst the contemporary context of a thriving urban setting.

METHODOLOGY

The main purpose of the study was to explore the challenges in preserving Intramuros' cultural tourism amidst competition, serving as a basis for a sustainable development plan to achieve the following objectives.

This study utilized a Quantitative-descriptive research design with 400 respondents. The sampled participants included visitors, students, tourism industry professionals, and local authorities, ages 18-53 and above. The instrument used in the study was a survey questionnaire.

The study is anchored in the theories of Kim, Uysal & Kirgy (2013) and Olatunji Apampa (2019). The model suggested that the strength of these perceptual relationships was moderated by the stage of tourism development in the community. Meanwhile, Olatunji Apampa's Theory emphasized the significance of community networks and cooperative efforts in the context of historic preservation. The role of cultural identity was highlighted as crucial in the appeal and maintenance of lateratures.






Figure 1: Kim, Uysal & Kirgy's Theory (2013)




Figure 2: Olatunji Apampa's Theory (2019)

RESULTS

The study employed a Quantitative-descriptive research design, a method deemed valid for exploring specific topics and establishing a foundation for further quantitative analysis, as suggested by Shuttleworth (2023). This approach allowed the researchers to systematically gather data, define characteristics, behaviors, and relationships among factors, and examine the demographic profile and perceptions of respondents regarding the challenges of preserving Intramuros' cultural tourism amidst competition from other destinations.

(2022) found that there are several challenges in preserving Intramuros for tourists in terms of historical preservation. These challenges include the limited participation of young individuals in heritage conservation activities and a lack of public awareness. Additionally, preserving the architectural heritage of the buildings requires a comprehensive approach that focuses on providing the best possible experience for visitors while ensuring the preservation of artifacts. In conclusion, addressing social engagement, disaster preparedness, and visitor experience are crucial factors in overcoming the obstacles to preserving Intramuros for tourists in terms of historical preservation.

Additionally, the tour guides in Intramuros are well-trained and friendly, with a WM of 3.46 and SD of 0.68, an and interpretation of "agree". Moreover, the management of tourism activities within Intramuros is considered effective, with a WM of 3.44 and SD of 0.68, and an interpretation of "agree".

This table is supported by Areola, et al. (2022), who found the importance of utilizing its cultural and historical significance by implementing effective strategies for managing tourism. Moreover, the significance of managing destinations, marketing techniques, and the influence of resources and image in attracting tourists are emphasized when it comes to effectively managing tourist spots. Additionally, it is vital to adopt responsible and sustainable approaches to tourism management, as outlined in the ICOMOS Draft International Charter for Cultural Heritage Tourism, in order to preserve cultural heritage and strengthen community resilience in the face of modern challenges (Martínez, 2022).

The involvement of the private sector is crucial for preserving Intramuros, with a WM of 3.55, a deviation of 0.64, with an interpretation of "strongly agree". It is believed that funding and resources for Intramuros should be a priority in government and organizational budgets, with a WM of 3.47, a deviation of 0.73, with the description of "agree".

Mekonnen, et al. (2022) found that the preservation of cultural heritages is facing significant challenges when it comes to funding and resources. The study highlights several factors that contribute to these challenges, including insufficient funding, the absence of national-level preservation policies, and a lack of technical infrastructure that hampers digitization and preservation projects. Moreover, the lack of proper management, monitoring, evaluation, stakeholder involvement, and government commitment, along with the effects of urbanization, agricultural practices, and natural disasters, further complicate the conservation of heritage sites.

According to Hazarudin et al. (2018), it is important to involve the community in various projects that aim to raise awareness about historic areas. This helps to highlight the significance of local perspectives and encourages people to actively participate. Moreover, it is common for the public to underestimate the internal damages that cultural property can suffer. Therefore, there is a need for better education on safety, protection, and risk-preparedness to avoid irreversible harm. In conclusion, improving public awareness requires recognizing different viewpoints, making heritage practices accessible to everyone, and promoting meaningful public involvement in conservation efforts.

In order to ensure the long-term sustainability of coastal destinations, adaptation paradigms have been developed to strike a balance between the tangible and intangible cultural values, all while considering financial limitations.

DISCUSSION

The findings of this study reveal that the majority of tourists visiting Intramuros fall within the 18-24 age group, predominantly female. This demographic suggests that young adults and women form a significant portion of visitors, indicating their interest in the historical and cultural significance of the area. The study also highlights the commendable performance of tourism authorities in Intramuros, who have successfully implemented initiatives related to historical preservation, tourism management, funding, and public awareness. Tourists expressed strong agreement on the importance of preserving and conserving historical and cultural assets, and they reported satisfaction with transportation accessibility, security, and the quality of cultural experiences offered.

The study concludes that there is a significant relationship between the challenges of preservation and the impact of cultural tourism on sustainable development. A well-preserved Intramuros fosters a positive cultural tourism experience, reinforcing its role as a heritage destination. The research findings serve as a foundation for the development of a brochure aimed at enhancing preservation efforts amidst growing competition. However, limitations due to the pandemic restricted the scope of the study, necessitating future research to address emerging challenges and evaluate the long-term effects of preservation strategies.

Based on these, several recommendations are proposed. Local authorities should maintain and improve their performance in preservation, tourism management, and public awareness campaigns, prioritizing the conservation of Intramuros' cultural assets. Enhancing transportation options, diversifying cultural experiences, and ensuring visitor safety are essential for sustaining tourist satisfaction. Furthermore, the proposed brochure should be disseminated to guide both authorities and tourists in preserving Intramuros as a competitive cultural tourism destination. Future studies should expand the research to include other heritage sites, exploring evolving challenges and innovative preservation strategies.


